DIRECTOR'S NOTE by Jasmine Joshua

We announced we were going to do Cabaret in 2019. We were three weeks into rehearsal in March of 2020 when the shutdown happened. And now here we are.

We originally chose to produce Cabaret, a show about the slow creep of fascism with some dance numbers in it, in advance of the 2020 presidential election. I decided that we could keep the original setting – I didn't think we needed to belabor the point.

Weimar Berlin was a remarkably liberated place and culture, even by today's standards, which is what made it so alluring to artists and writers like Christopher Isherwood, who wrote the story this musical is based upon. Berlin was an international city, filled with people from all over the world, with many languages spoken in the streets, and all genders and sexualities explored and accepted. Our show is not a gender or color blind cast – the diversity of our cast is reflective of the diversity of Weimar Berlin, a flourishing city crushed

by fascism and the homogeneity it demands. While some might call our cast "nontraditional," I would argue that our cast is actually historically accurate.

My reboot for Cabaret is really more of a refocus than it is a reboot. I wanted to examine how privilege intersects with activism. At what point did you notice something was wrong? What could you do about it? What does every person, with all their different privileges and varying levels of social capital in the face of white supremacism, decide to do? Our casting contextualizes their character's choices in this show, which puts the plights of Fraulein Schneider and even Sally Bowles in a different light.

As for the ending? As a Jewish American who is acutely aware of the number "six million," I wanted to emphasize that there were people who said something, did something.

So what would you do? May your answer, at the very least, be "Something."

Alexei Cifrese (Fraulein Kost/Fritzie) Alexei Cifrese had a beautifully written bio once upon a time, but like many things in this accursed era, it has been lost to the annals of Google Docs. In February 2021, his and Brendan Mack's choose-your-own-adventure play *Vampires of the Neverwood* - about a pole dancing warrior who teams up with her estranged librarian sister and three unlikely heroes to battle the forces of evil and save the world - graced YouTube with

its presence and was super cool and stuff. Keep an eye out for their next creation *Birdbones*, a hoot-done-it opera! Alexei also got into voice acting and has since started recording his first audiobook *I Guess We're Heroes* written by college friend and expert Dungeon Master, Graham Fluster. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Theatre Off Jackson acknowledges that we are operating on the ancestral lands of the Duwamish people who are the original stewards of this land and continue to live here today. We honor the work of Indigenous artists in our community and understand how important Indigenous art is to the future of this land. The Duwamish people have an oral history that stretches back to the last Ice Age. Their ancestral lands encompass the Seattle/Greater King County area, and they have given care and Lushshootseed names to the geography that surrounds us today. An acknowledgement like this is nowhere near enough to heal a history of colonization and the unkept promises made in The Treaty of Point Elliot in 1855, but it is a start to better align ourselves with Indigenous communities and grow to become stronger advocates for Indigenous rights. Today, the Duwamish still host events and meet at the Duwamish Longhouse located in what we call West Seattle. The Duwamish are continuously fighting to become a federally recognized tribe and you can stand with them by writing a letter of support to your local, state, and federal representatives using the resources from the Duwamish Tribe website. www.duwamishtribe.org
